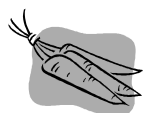

Pumpkin Carving : *all pumpkins to be fully hollowed out of all seeds etc and cap cut out but left in place (tea-light candles will be placed in suitable entries for display purposes), adult assistance in cutting junior entries allowed*

- 40 Pumpkin carving, open (all ages)
- 41 Pumpkin carving, 12-16 years
- 42 Pumpkin carving, under 12 years

Junior Gardener (open to all children under 16 years) : *all entries to be planted, maintained and harvested entirely by the child (adult advice and assistance in bed preparation only allowed).*
